Attendance and Lateness

As you know, children's attendance is monitored and reviewed in partnership with the Education Welfare Service. I would like to remind you that if your child is absent, you must inform the school of a reason for your child's absence so it can be recorded. You should email or phone the school office (leaving a voice mail) on the first day of your child's absence.

It is also important that your child comes to school on time. Class starts at 9.00am sharp. If your child arrives late, this is recorded on their registration certificate and can impact on their overall attendance rate.
