Spring is here and the days are getting brighter! March will be a very busy month full of celebrations for our Nursery children as they participate in celebrations and learning about the diversity of others.

March Learning Focus

Theme: Spring Has Sprung!

Colours: Green & Yellow

Shape: Diamond

Children are noticing the changes in weather and season around them. This month we will focus on discussing spring and the basic concepts concerning living things and growth. We will learn about what grows on a farm, the mother and baby animals found on farms, and how they are cared for. We will become scientists during Science Week exploring how plants grow, as well as, other exciting investigations.

The children will be exploring different fairy tales this month. We will continue to share books with the children, teaching them how to understand left to right directionality of print and how to turn the pages appropriately. We will continue to establish a print rich environment where children are encouraged to experiment with mark making in a range of situations. We will also celebrate World Book Day on Thursday 7th March with a visit from Mr Hullabaloo and our 'Tiger Who Came to Tea' Teaparty.

Mathematical experiences will be incorporated into almost every aspect of our play (including exposure to number, patterns and problem solving experiences) and mathematical thinking and vocabulary encouraged and extended whenever possible.

March will also see the children celebrating the run up to the Easter. At this time of year we will support the children to consider the needs of others as we support this years Trocaire campaign. We will update you with more information about this later on this month.

What do you need to do?

Encourage your child(ren) to walk, use a wheelchair, scoot or cycle to school on as many days as possible during the event.

Why we are taking part

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel is a great way to build physical activity in children's daily routine which is important for their physical health and mental wellbeing.

Active school runs also help to reduce congestion and air pollution outside the school gate. <u>A 2021</u> YouGov study showed nearly half of UK children worry about air pollution near their school. And that children thought active travel was the best away to bring down these pollution levels.

Plus there are some great prizes to be won every day if we get enough children taking part!




This month we are hoping to develop our Mud Kitchen area. If you have any of the following items you no longer need and could donate to us we would be very grateful:
