# **PEACE PROMS**

### ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

In order to continue to raise standards in our school, we are trying to improve punctuality and attendance. If your child is absent for any reason, a written note must be given to the class teacher to explain the absence. You may phone the office to inform us that your child will not be present but we would also ask for a written note to be sent in once your child returns to school. Teachers will be recording reasons for absences and, along with the Senior Leadership Team, will be monitoring children's attendance. Please note that children's poor attendance will be referred to the Education Welfare Officer.

It is also very important that all children are in class at 9.00am and this will also be monitored by the class teacher. Any child who is late three times in one month will receive a letter indicating that they have been late and reminding the parents/ guardians of the importance of the child being in class at 9.00am. When a child is late for class, not only does it disrupt the class but the child can feel flustered and upset. Please try to ensure that your child is in class ready to begin their day at 9.00am. Please note that when a child is late for class it is recorded on their attendance record.

I would like to remind you that, in the morning, we ask parents/guardians of Year 2-7 children to leave their children at the front door or in the children's entrance foyer in the morning and let the children make their own way to their classroom.

**MORNING ARRANGEMENTS** 

I would also remind you that all teachers supervise the children from 8.50am and it can be very difficult for them to talk to parents at this time. If you need to inform the teacher of something, please send a note with your child or contact the office and a message can be given to the teacher. If you need to speak with the teacher, please phone the office to arrange an appointment. Please remember that parents should not go up the stairs in the morning.

### LATE ARRIVALS

If your child is late arriving at school, please report to the office. Children will then make their own way to the classroom or, if necessary, a Classroom Assistant will meet them at the office and take them to their classroom. Please note that when a child is late for class it is recorded on their attendance record.

## **HEATHY EATING**

As a health promoting school, I would remind you that children should bring a healthy break to school. Information regarding healthy breaks can be found in the September St James's Jotter which can be downloaded from our website. I would also remind you that we are a nut free school and children should not bring nut products to school. Due to being a health promoting school and in the interest of children with allergies, we are unable to give the children cakes or treats sent in by parents/ guardians when it is their birthday. I appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

### **CAR PARKING**

#### ACCELERATED READER HOME CONNECT

We are pleased that parents and carers now have the opportunity to use Renaissance Home Connect. This is a means of monitoring children's reading practice by allowing access to Accelerated Reader at home. Renaissance Home Connect provides a snapshot of each child's reading progress including average percentage correct on quizzes, number of points earned and results of the last quiz taken (reading quizzes can only be taken in school). Parents and carers can also see all of the books read by their own child. We are sure that Renaissance Home Connect will prove to be a valuable tool in helping parents to encourage their child to read and in helping to monitor progress towards reaching reading targets. The children in Years 4 to 7 have already been given the website address and their login details. If you have any questions about Home Connect please feel free to ask the class teacher or Mrs Kelly (Coordinator).

## TAKE CARE!

It is great to see some of our children coming

to school on their bicycles. However, I would like to remind you that, in the interests of your child's safety, when riding a bicycle,

You will be aware the internet hosts many exciting opportunities for education. The online world is a wonderful place for young people to explore, with unprecedented opportunities for learning and creativity, but just like the real world there are risks and dangers they should be aware of and which we should all act to protect them from.

As part of the curriculum, teachers ensure that pupils are taught about e-safety and acceptable online behaviour. Each year, we have an 'Internet Safety Awareness' week in school and this year, to mark Safer Internet Day on the 9 February, our awareness week will take place during the week beginning 8 February 2016.

Teachers will be planning lessons based on Internet Safety, using resources from the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOP) <u>www.thinkuknow.co.uk</u>. This is an excellent website offering advice to teachers and parents on ensuring your child is not accessing inappropriate content online.

In order to help with child care arrangements, we will supervise Nursery and Primary School children at this time.
